Dear Families,



Wishing you all health and happiness during the start of this Holiday Season...



Pour Some Gravy on Me... By Leslie Markowski




Morning Drop Off

While we still have COVID-19 cases in the schools, we are also starting to see the onset of cold and flu season throughout the district. The New Hampshire Department of Education has asked us to remind families of the following:

- Staff and students who are feeling ill, have a fever, or have new or unexpected symptoms (cough, running nose, etc.) should stay home until their symptoms have improved and they are void of any fever, vomiting, or diarrhea for 24 hours without the aid of medication.
- The Public Health division of the New Hampshire Department of Health and Humans Services
 follows CDC guidelines, which recommend that individuals and families test for COVID-19 if an
 individual is presenting symptoms. Neither CDC nor Public Health requires testing for COVID-19.
- Staff and students who test positive for COVID-19 should follow <u>CDC guidelines</u> for isolation and quarantine.
- It is inconsistent with state law and beyond the authority of the local school district to require a student's exclusion from school as a result of local school district policies that require testing or masking of students (without a positive COVID-19 test).

Simply put - if your child is not feeling well enough to attend school and fully participate in the academic program, we would like them to stay home to rest and recuperate. Per our policy, if they are vomiting or have a fever, they may not return to school until they are symptom-free without medication for 24 hours.

As stated above and as was shared at the start of the school year in our COVID-19 Plan, we cannot require students or staff to test before returning to school if they have symptoms consistent with COVID-19. However, we strongly recommend that you administer a home test to be certain that their symptoms are not an indication of COVID-19.

Finally, students and staff who test positive for COVID-19 should isolate for 5 days. Upon their return to school, we recommend, but do not require, that they wear a mask for 5 additional days. Students who are exposed to COVID-19 are not excluded from attending school but should be monitored for new and unexplained symptoms.

As many are aware, our program is primarily funded through a 21st Century Community Learning Center grant. This grant is the only federal funding that specifically funds out-of-school-time activities such as Afterschool, & Summer programming. We have been awarded this highly competitive grant to <u>ensure all of our students have the opportunity</u> to participate and engage in co-curricular programming.

We understand that the past two years have brought a variety of challenges to both students and their families and we want to do everything in our power to help get kids engaged, active, and socializing with friends. For that reason, Afterschool will be free for all this year! We would like to have as many students participate as possible, however, space is limited. We ask that when you register for the program, you take into consideration the following guidelines to ensure we are able to offer the highest quality of programs possible.

Our Schedule

3:10-4:00 Snack & Discovery Through Play

Snack is offered at no cost. After checking in and eating, students are able to get active and play outside with friends.

4:00-5:00 Clubs

Three clubs are offered daily in our program. These clubs are based on student interest and give the opportunity for students to discover new hobbies, learn through doing, and engage with friends. Students will sign up for clubs each session.

5:00-5:30 Homework & Enrichment

As part of our 21st CCLC funding, daily homework and academic enrichment is offered to all students. If your child does not have homework, we will work with them to practice key academic skills such as reading and math. This is done in a variety of ways. Dismissal from the program begins at 5:00. If your child is in need of academic assistance, we ask that they stay at the program until after 5:30.

5:30-6:00 Daily Wrap Up

This is the time that we reflect on our day and get ready to go home to enjoy our family time!
